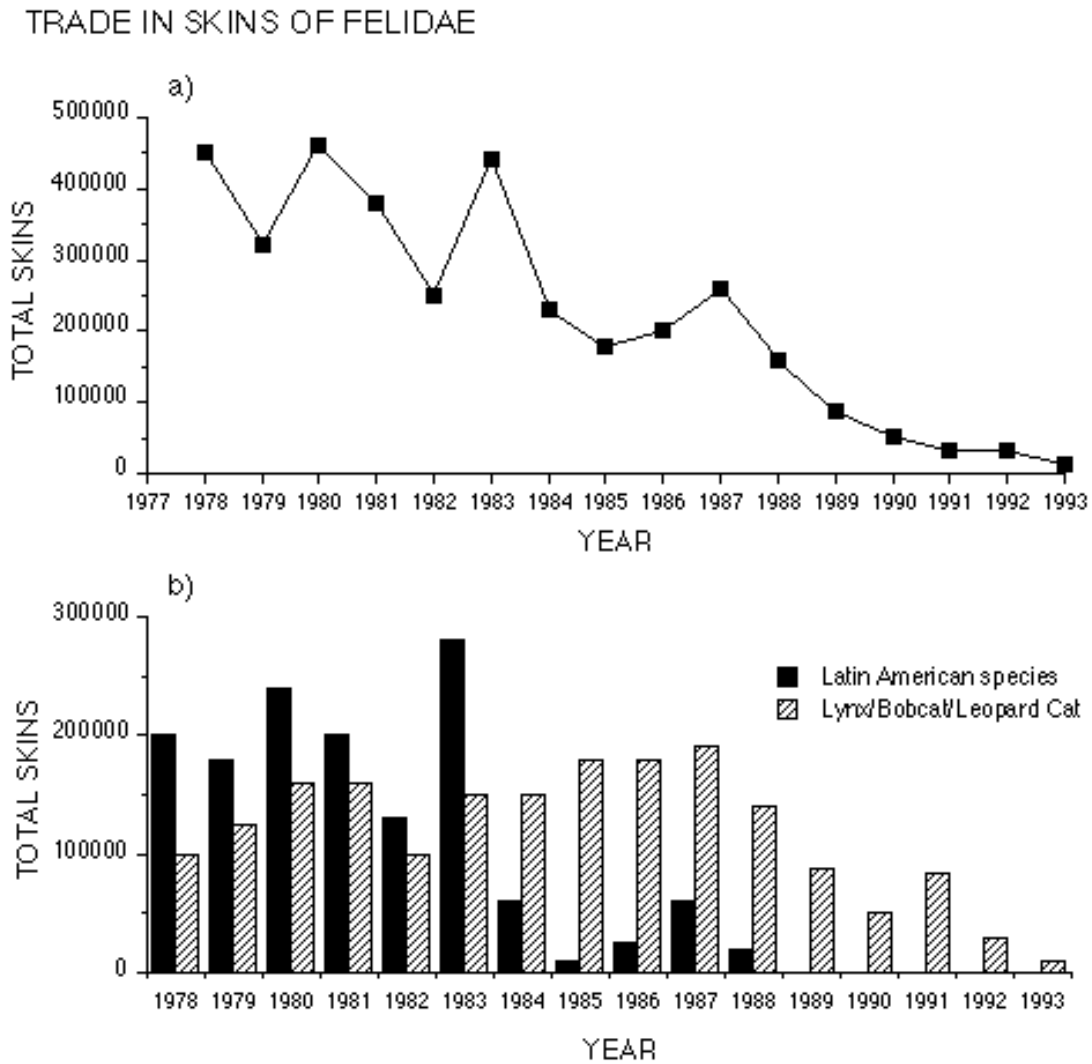

AND RISE IN PRICE OF HORN IN CONSUMING NATIONS

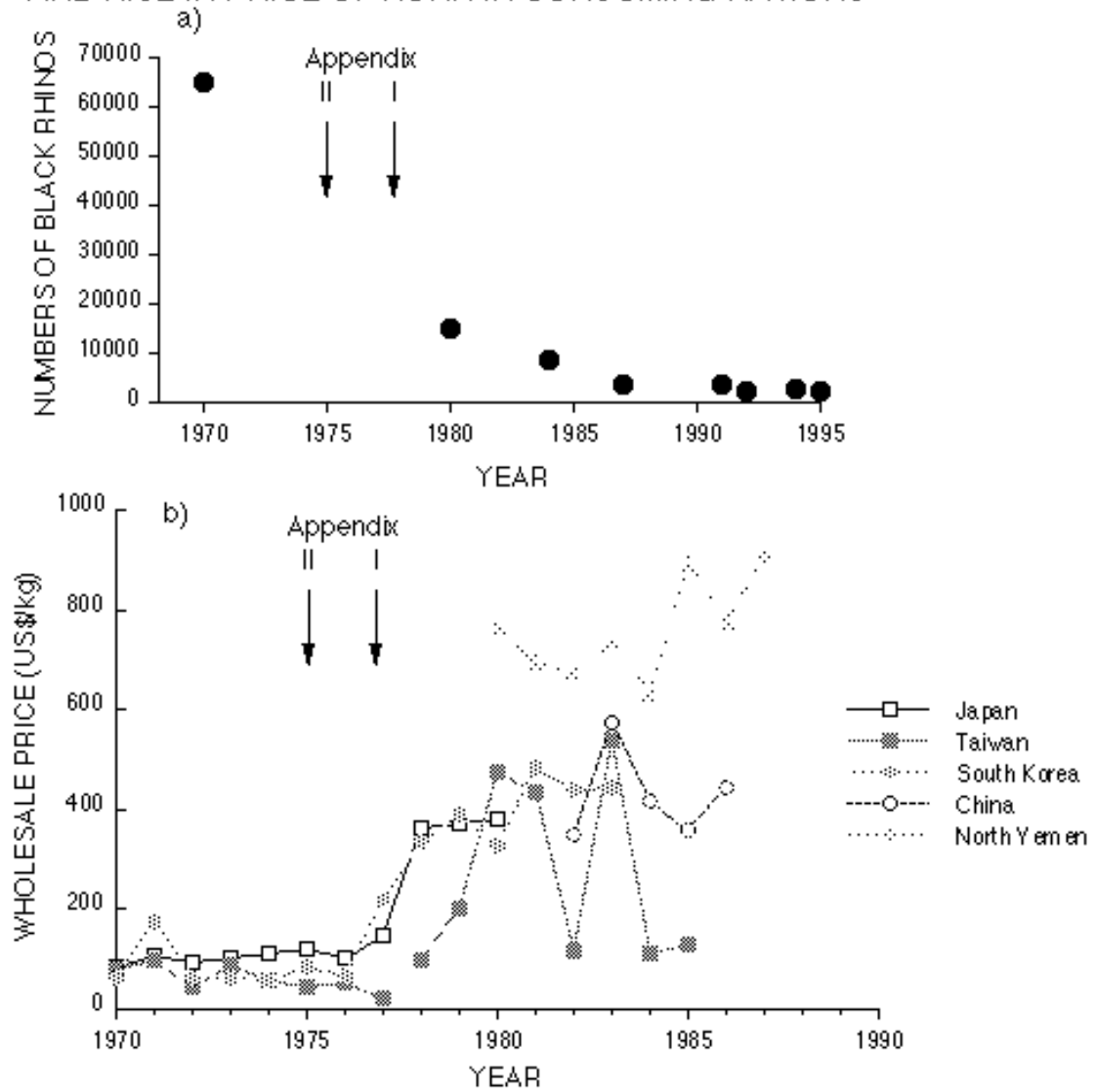

ILLEGAL SALE OF BLACK RHINO HORN IN TAIWAN

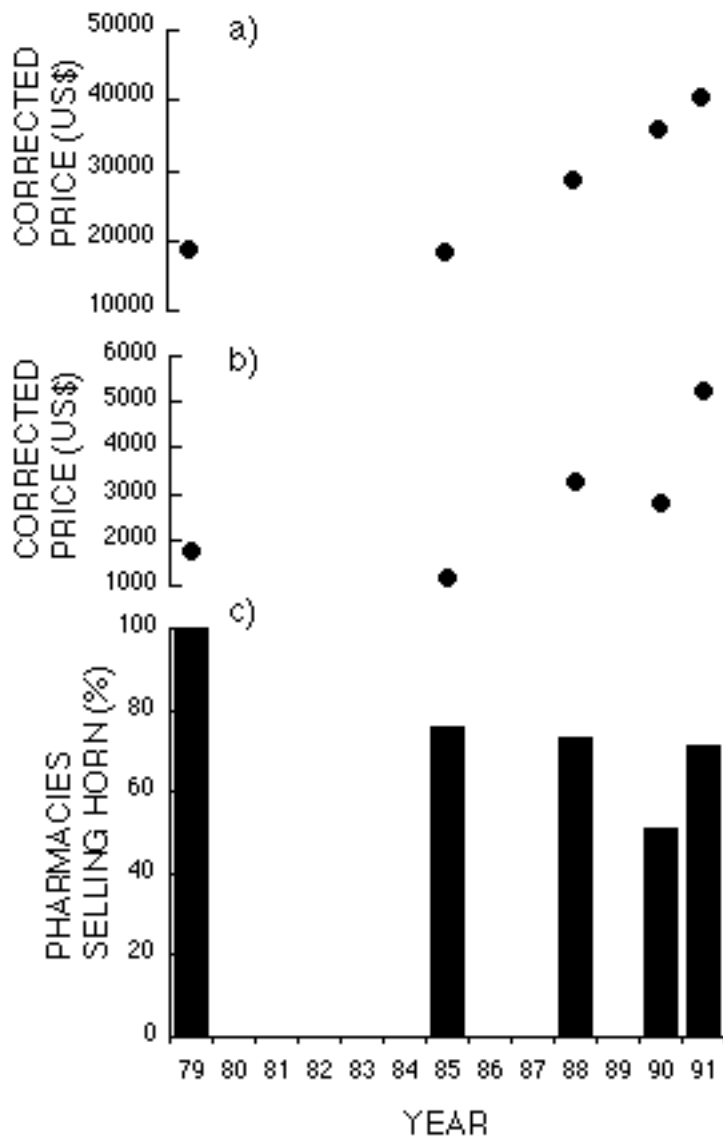

ADDITIONS OR TRANSFER OF TAXONOMIC GROUPS ONTO HIGHER APPENDICES

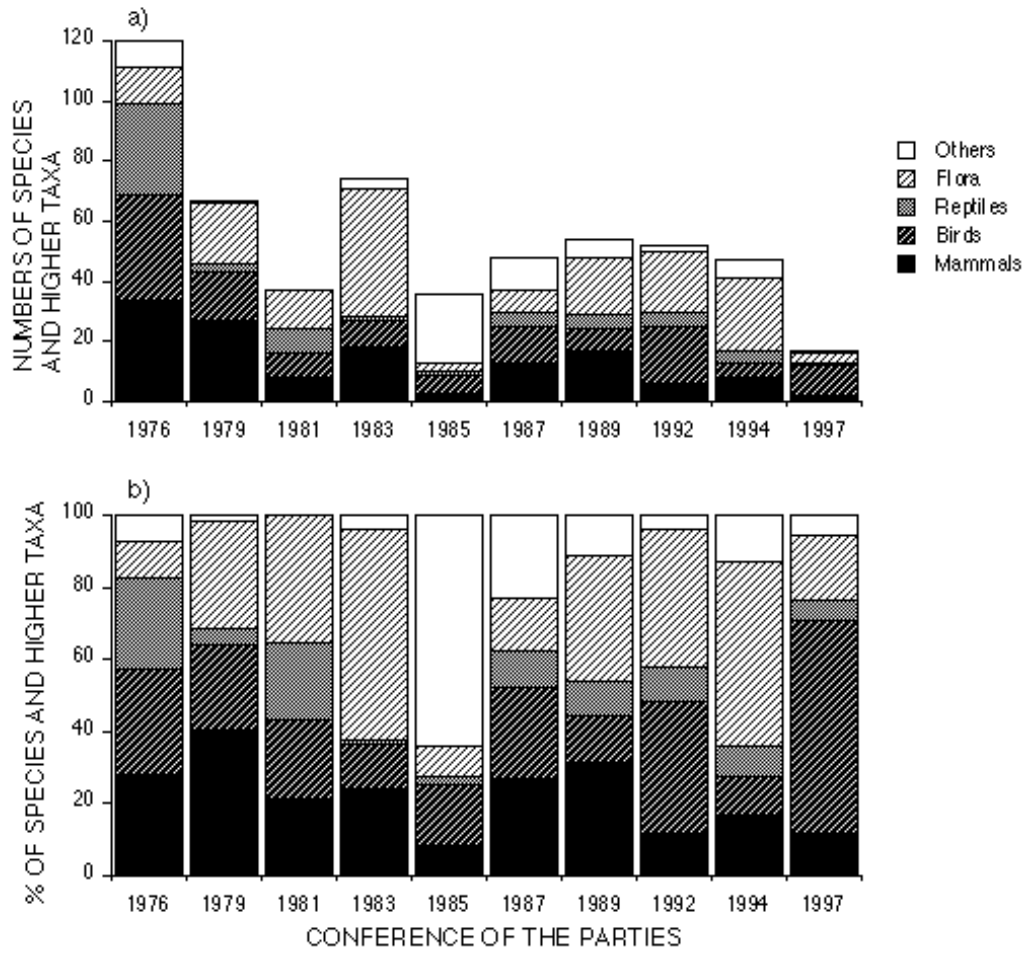

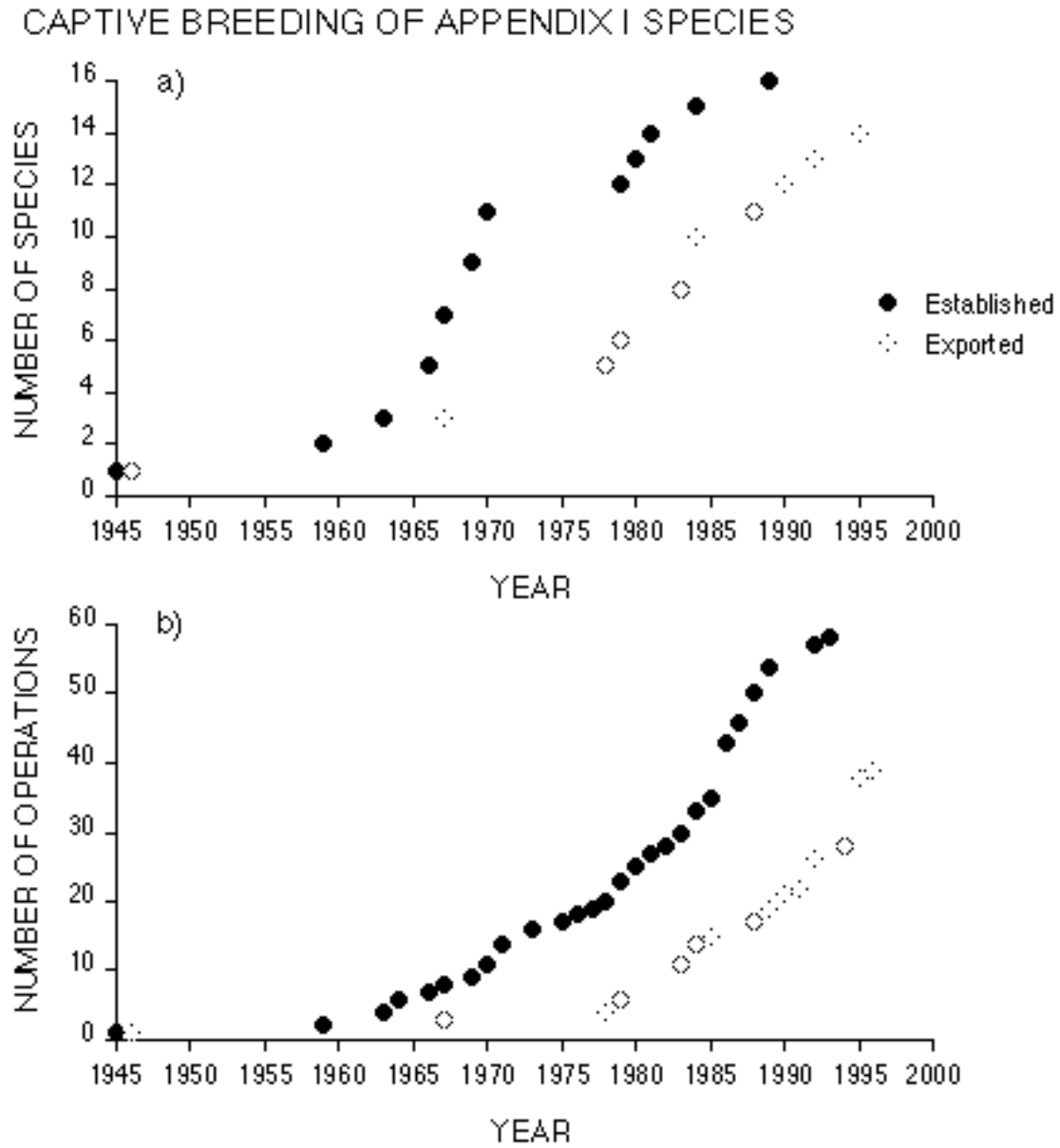

NILE CROCODILE RANCHING AND QUOTAS

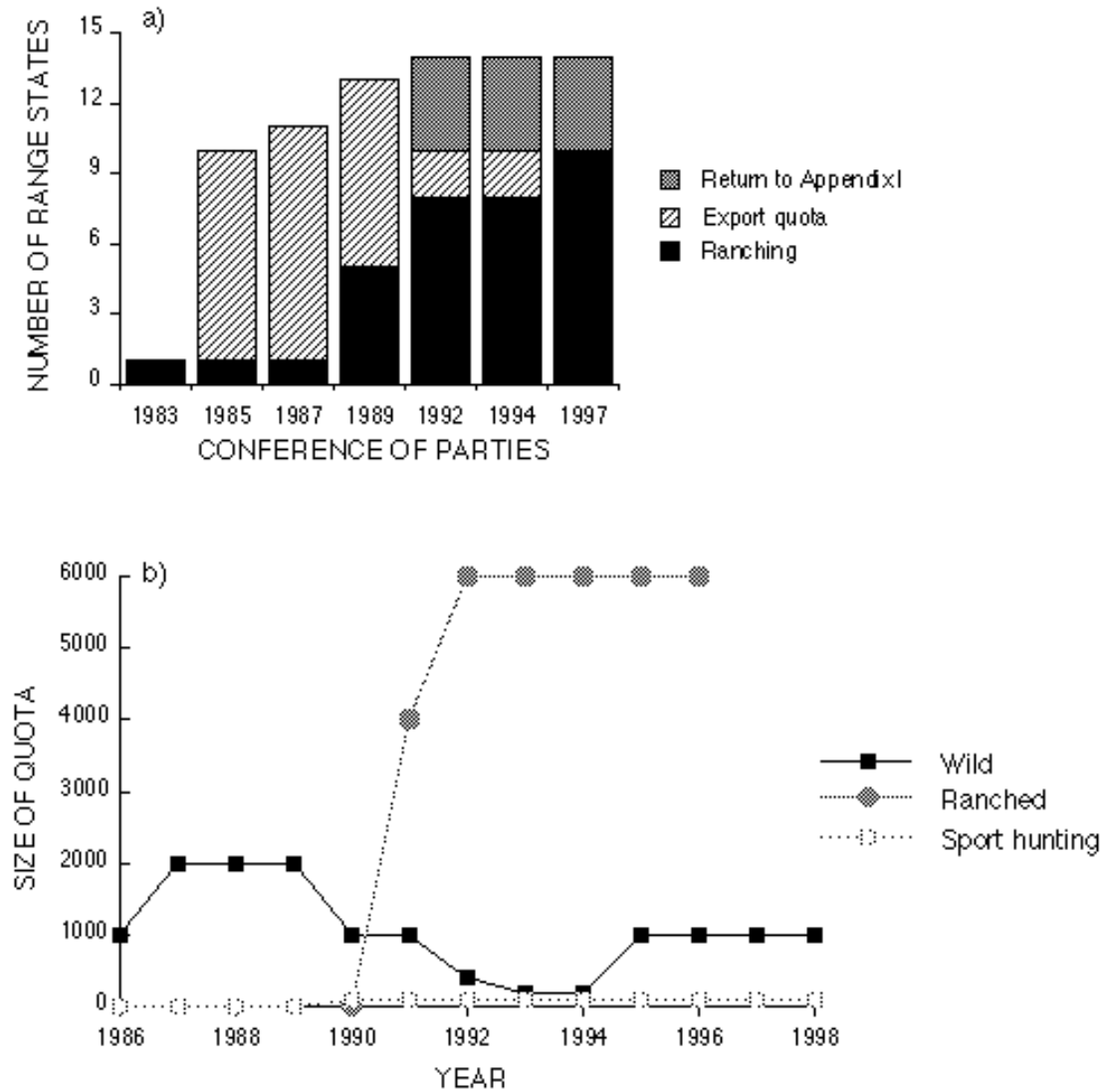

USE OF NILE CROCODILES IN ZIMBABWE AND TANZANIA

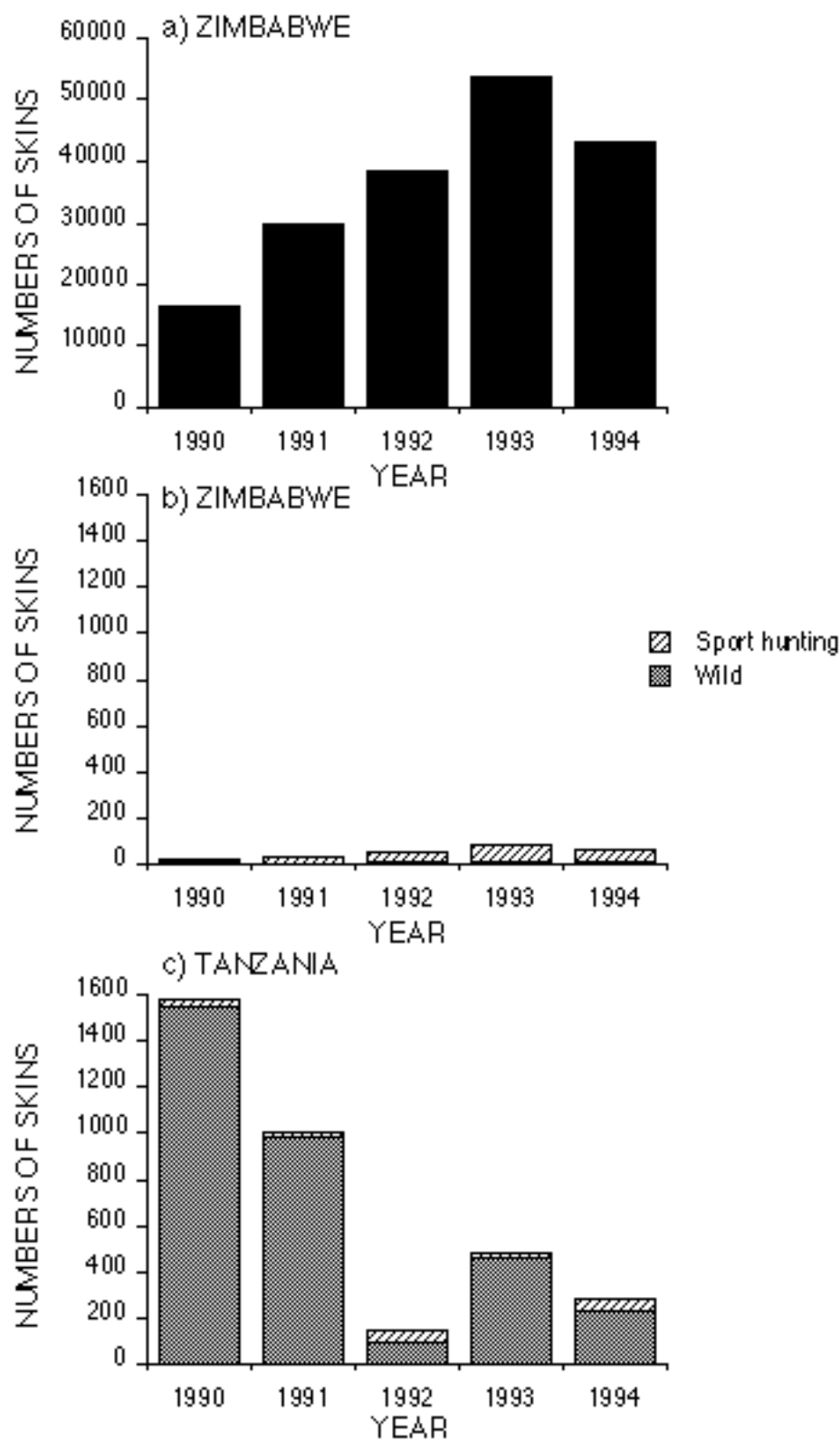

TRADE IN LEOPARD TROPHIES AND SKINS

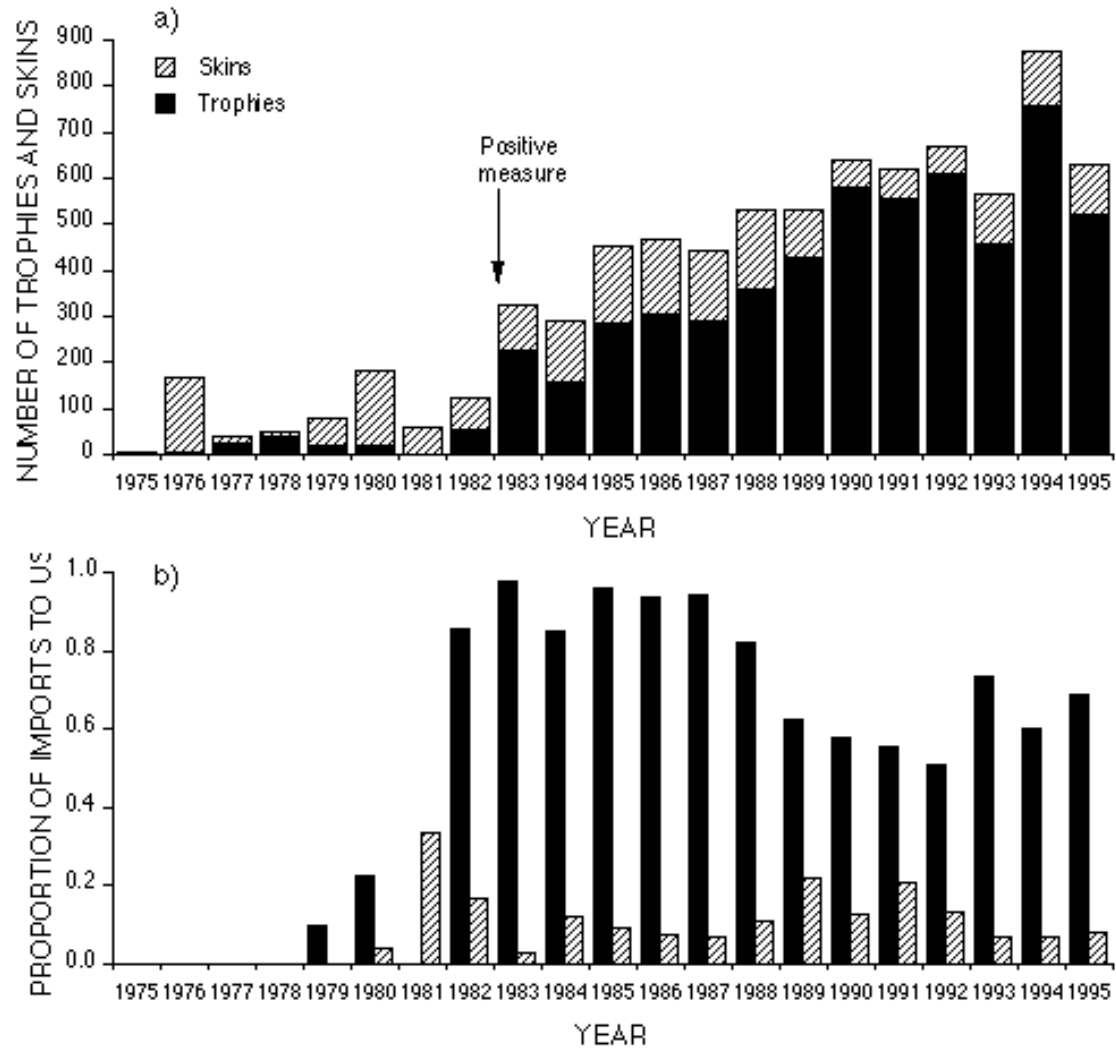

CHEETAH IMPORTS

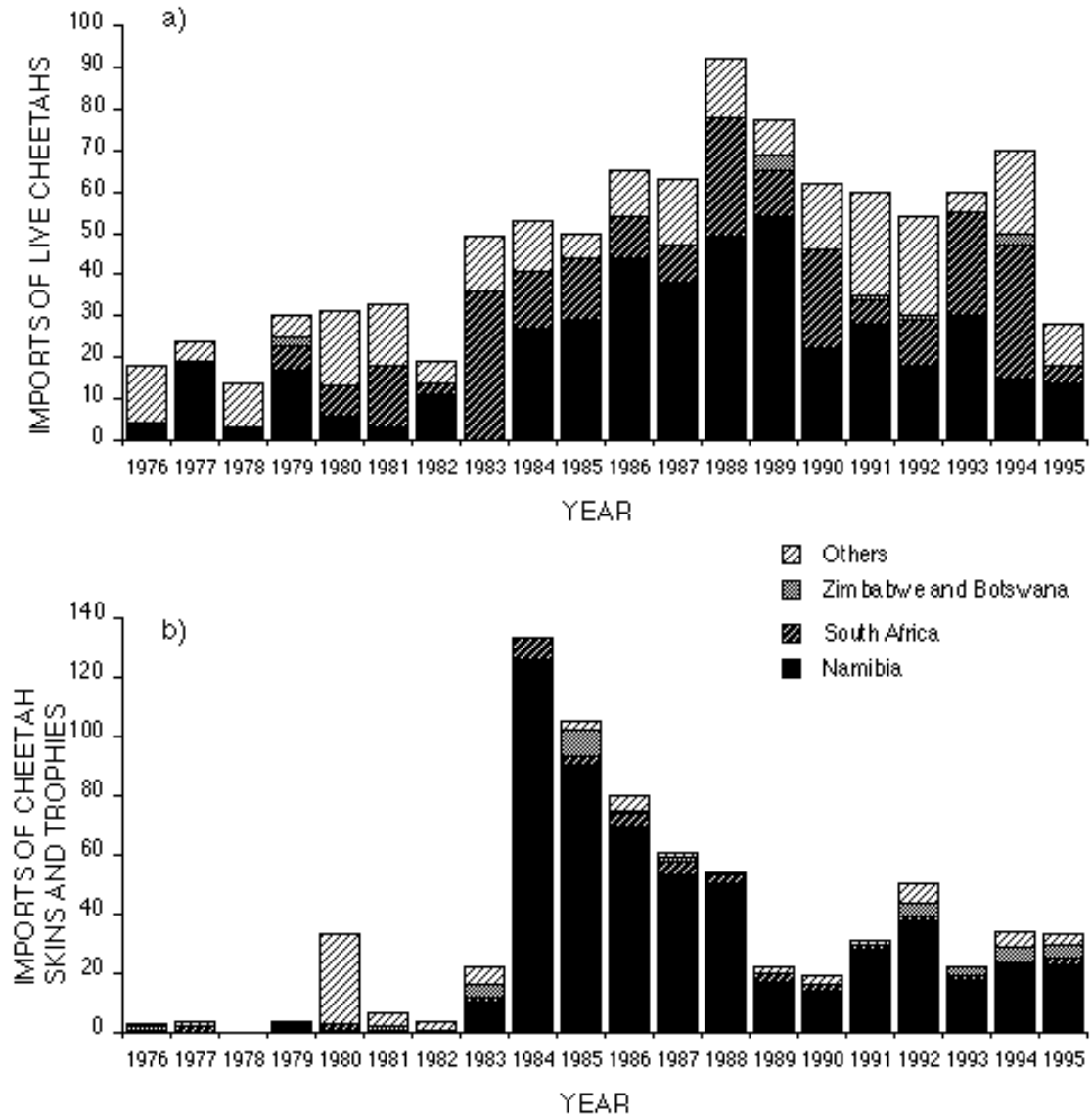

LIVE SALES AND HUNTING OF WHITE RHINOS IN SOUTH AFRICA

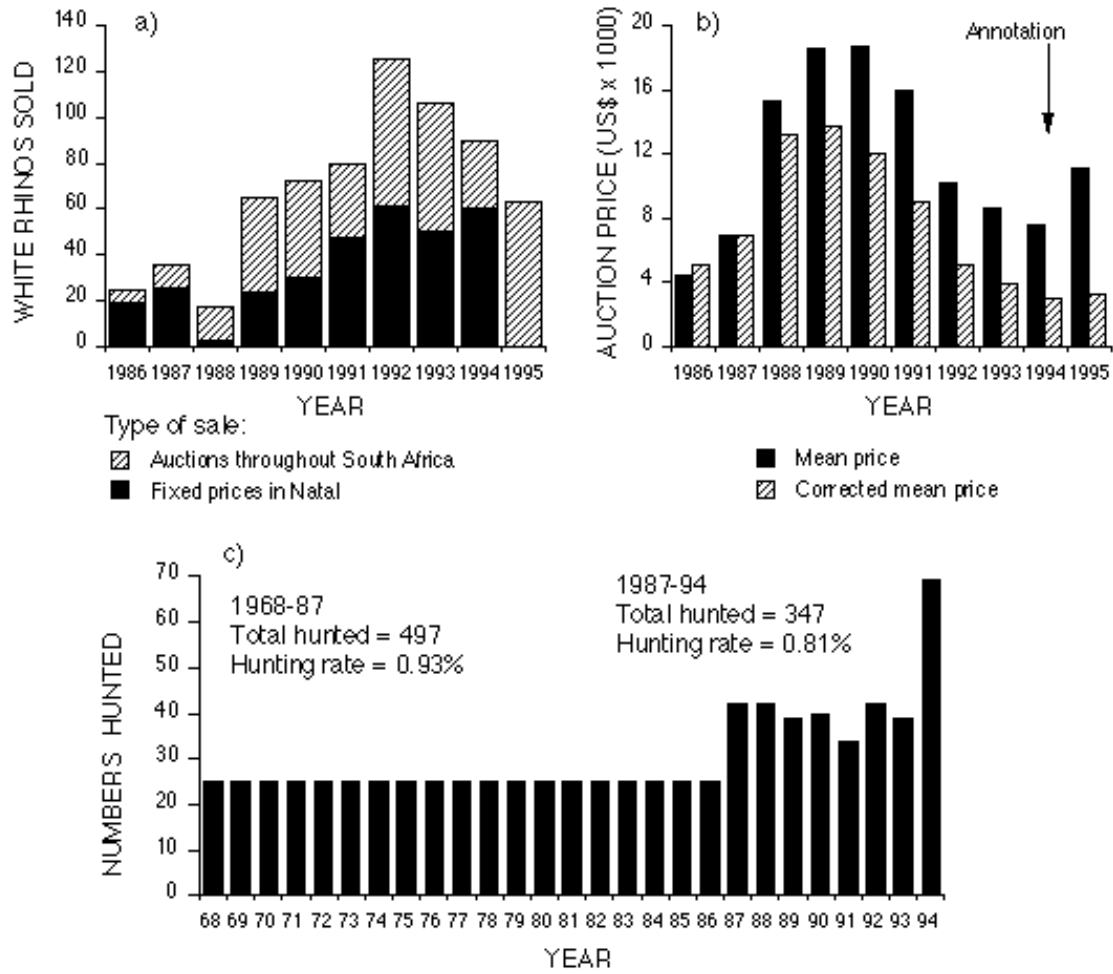

ANIMAL SPECIES AND RANGE STATES INCLUDED IN THE SIGNIFICANT TRADE PROCESS

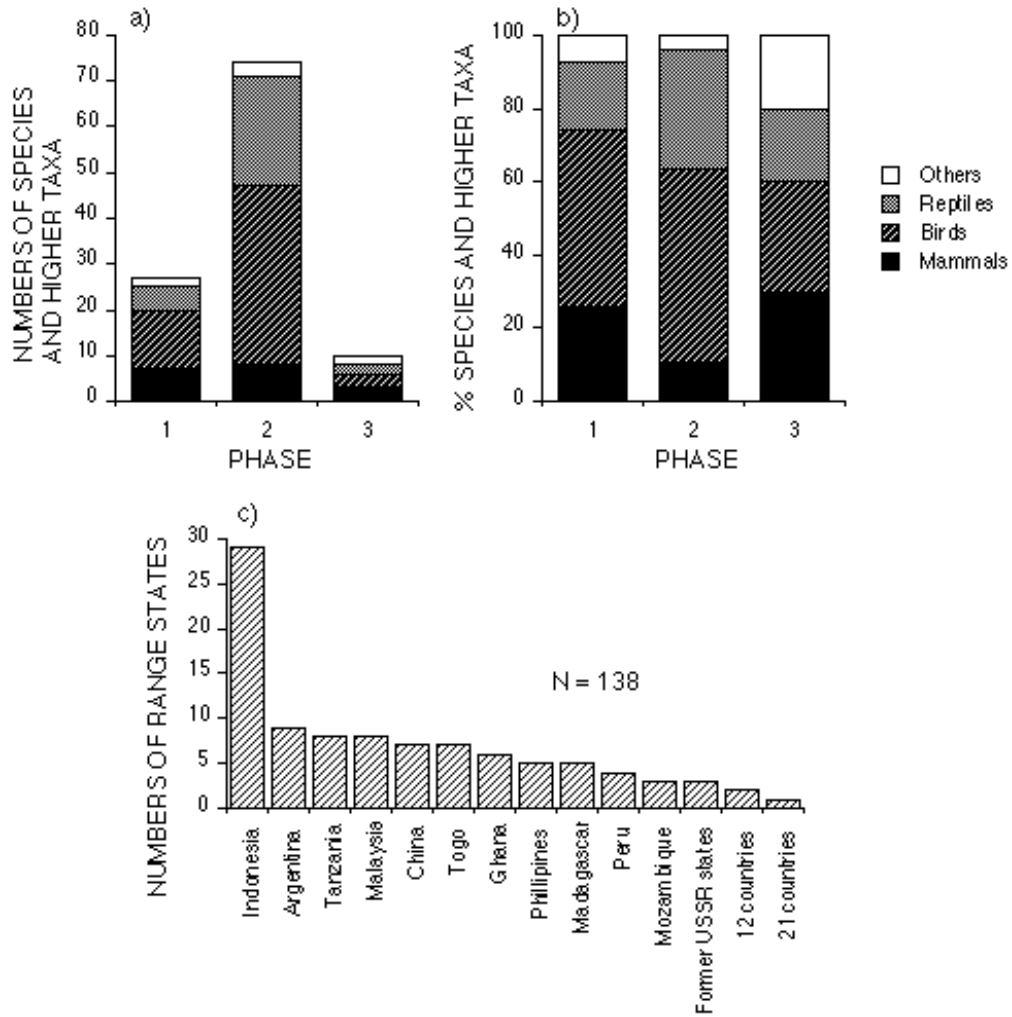


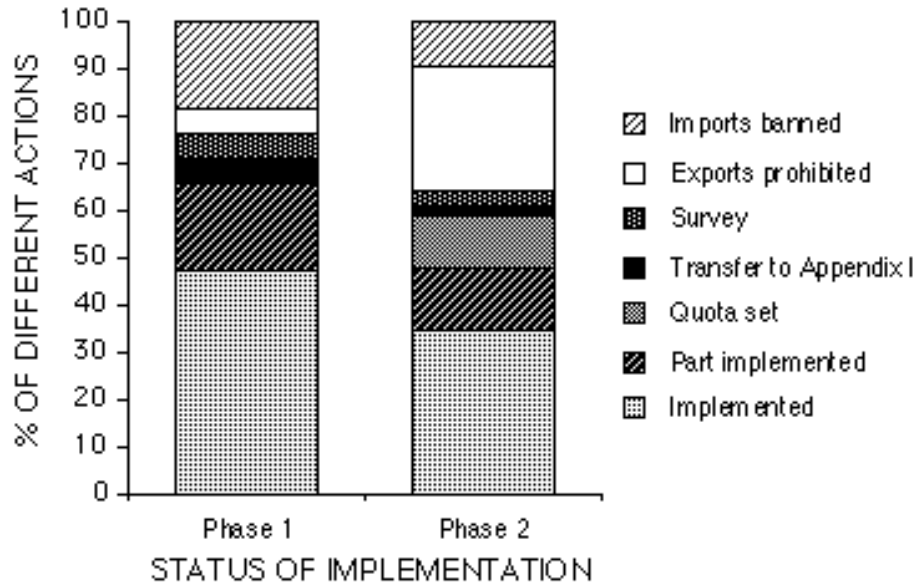
Figure 14ACTIONS TAKEN FOR ANIMALS UNDER

Figure 15: The Demand Curve

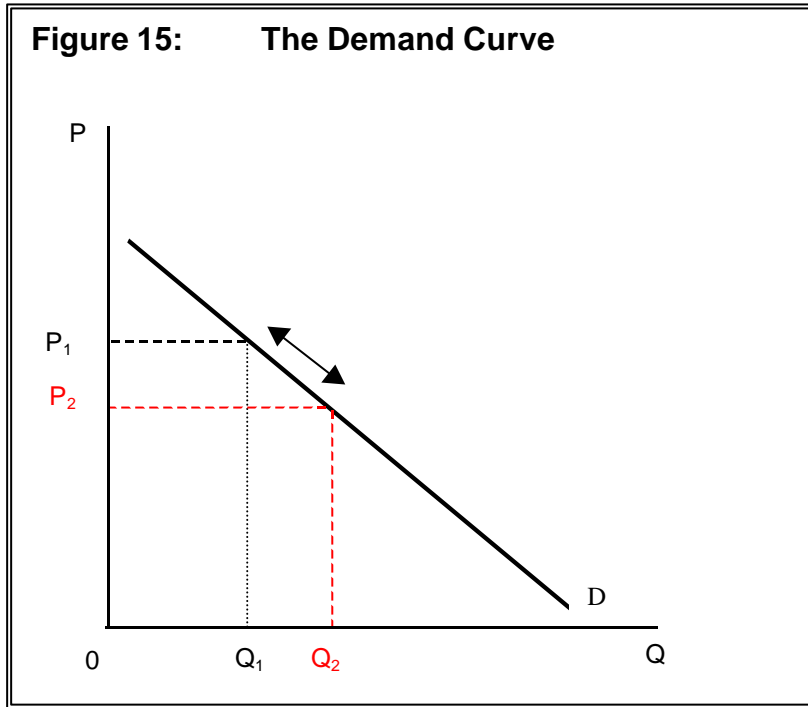


Figure 16: A Shift in Demand

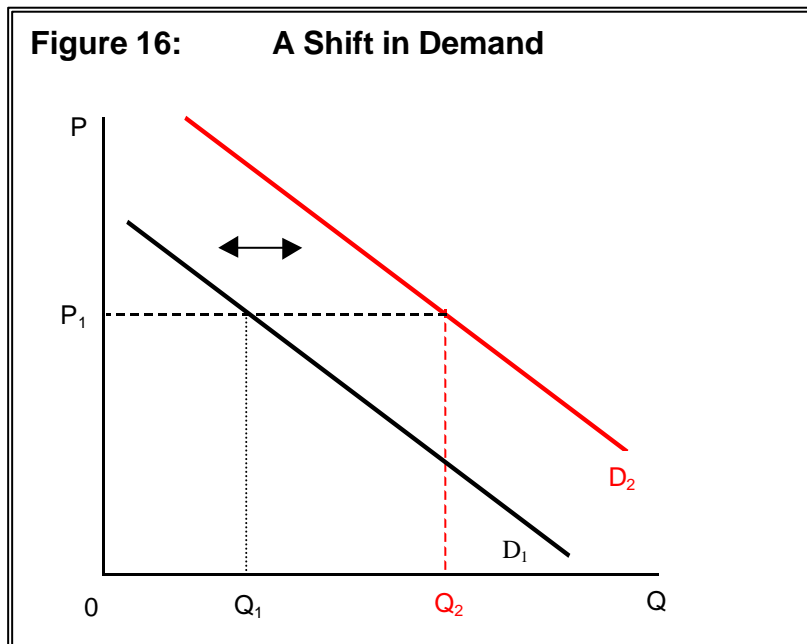


Figure 17: A Shift in Supply

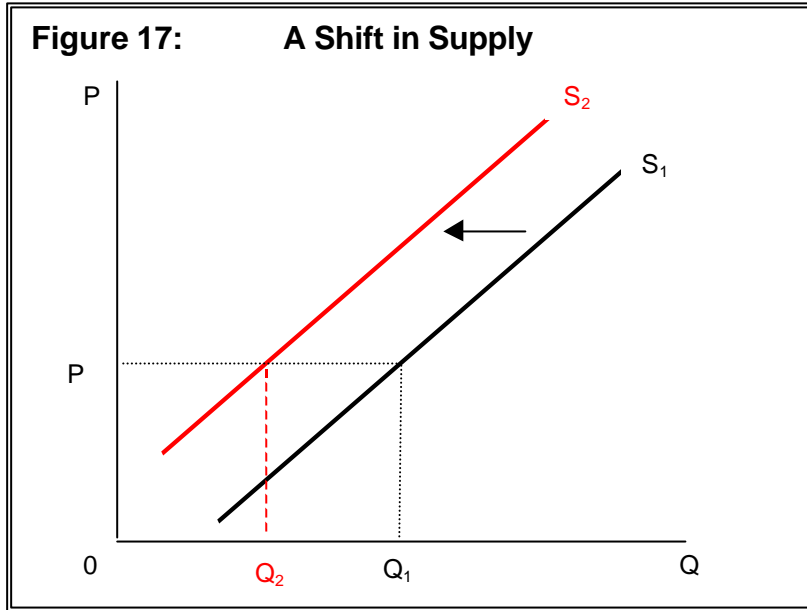


Figure 18: Supply and Demand

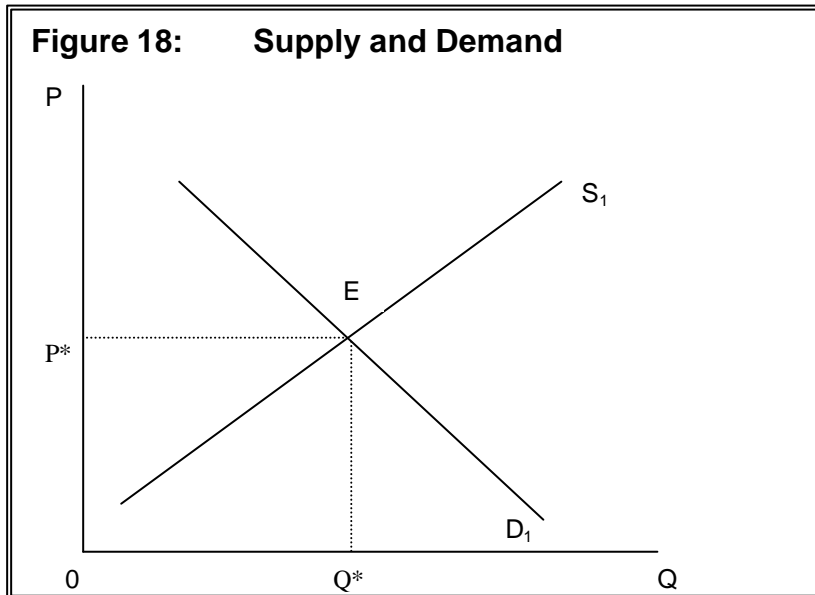
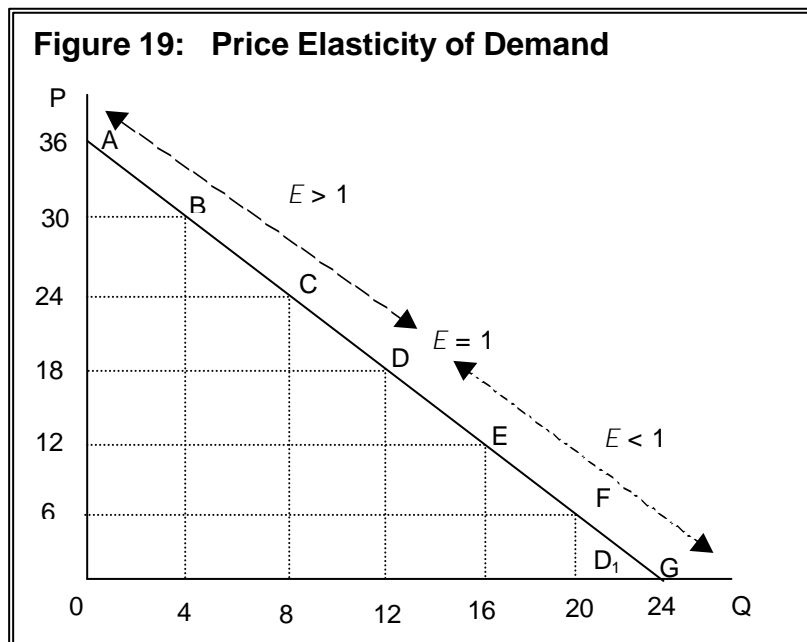


Figure 19: Price Elasticity of Demand



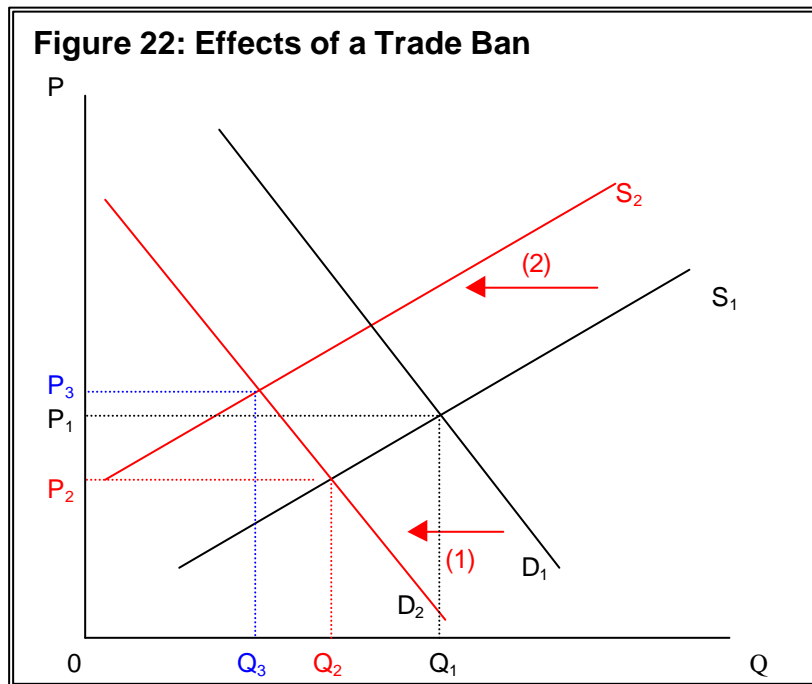
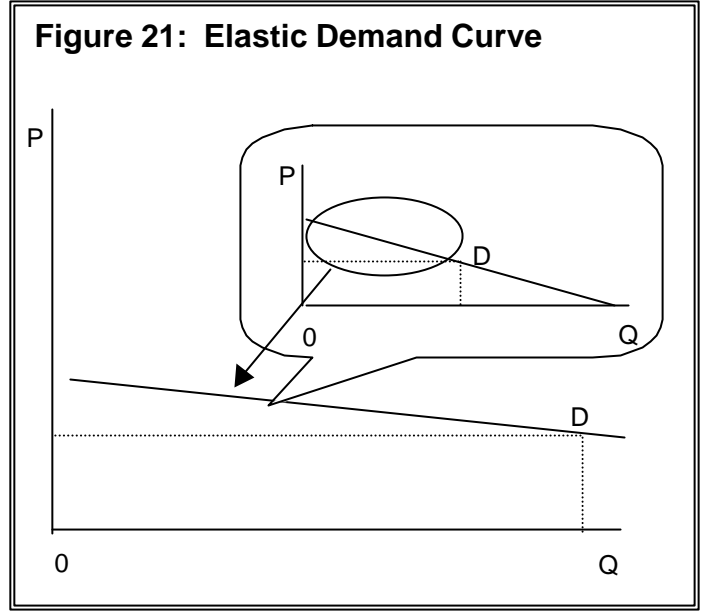
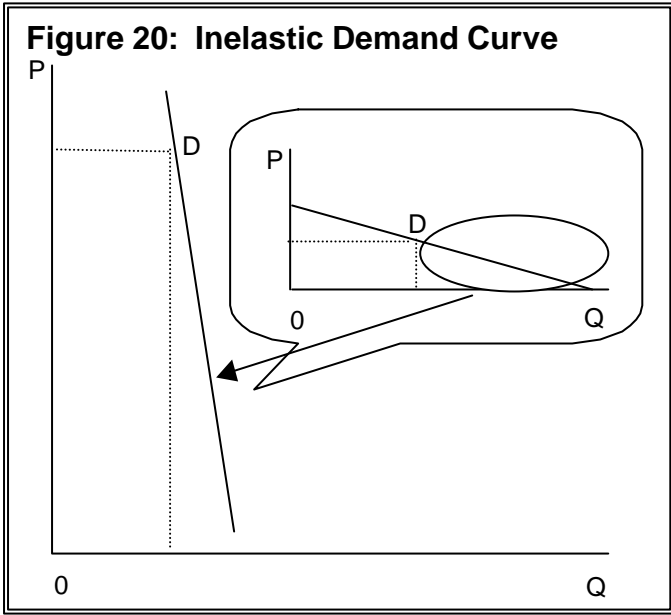


Figure 23: Elastic Supply

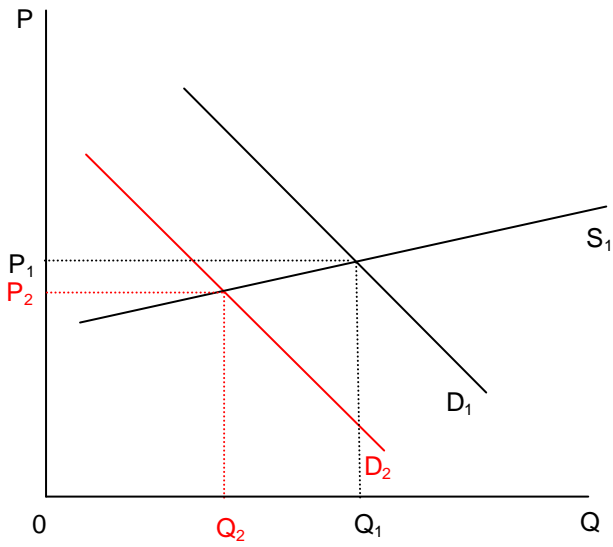


Figure 24: Inelastic Supply

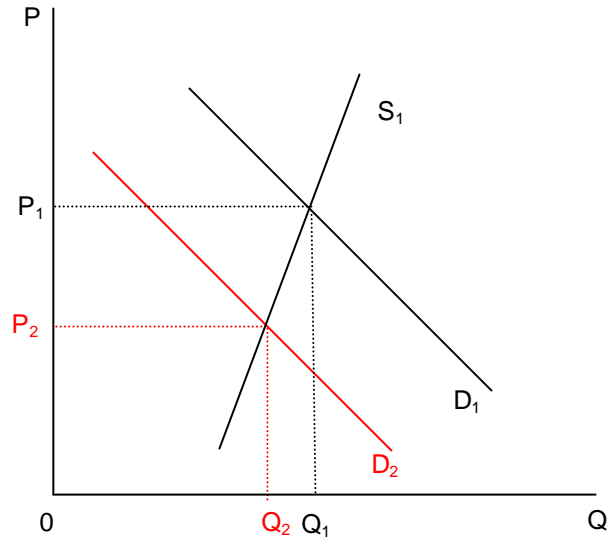


Figure 25: Elastic Demand

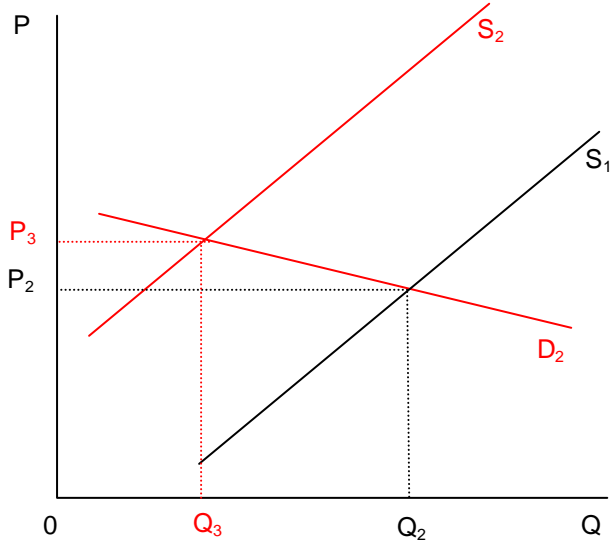


Figure 26: Inelastic Demand

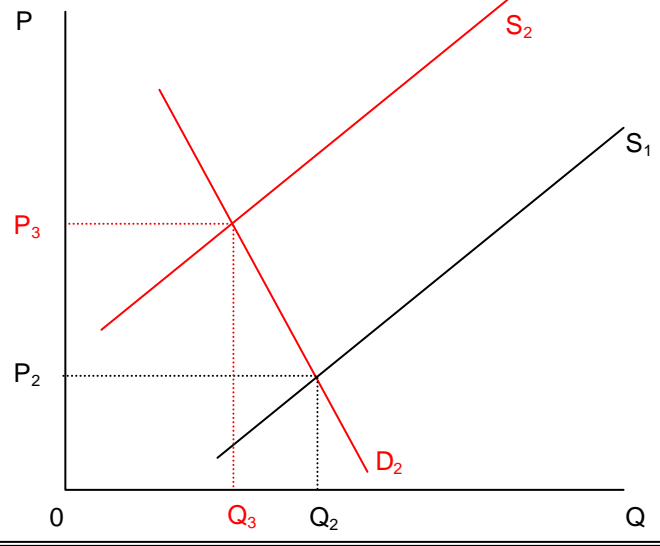


Figure 27: Elastic Demand & Supply

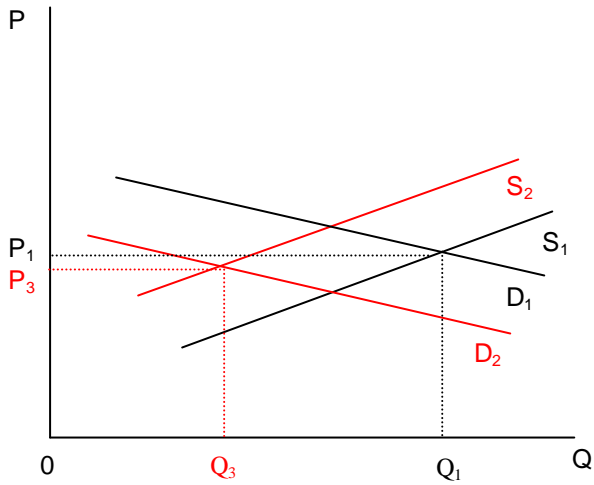


Figure 28: Inelastic Demand & Supply

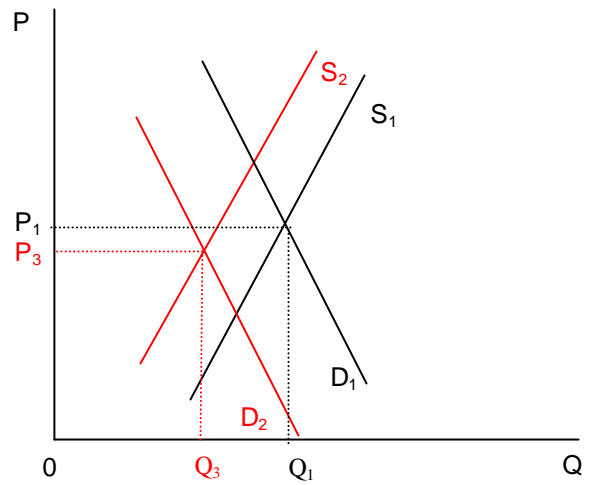


Figure 29: Total Revenue with Elastic D and Large Shift in S

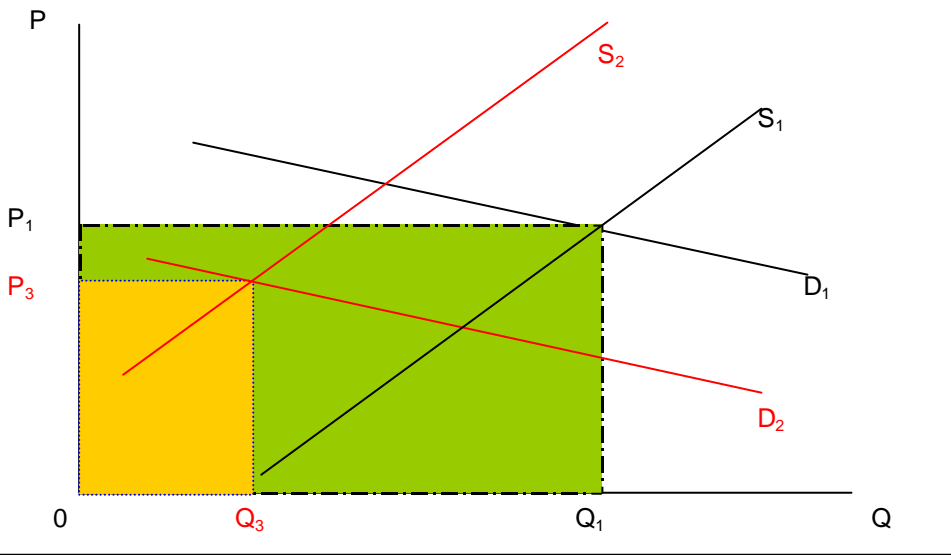


Figure 30: Total Revenue with Elastic D and Small Shift in S
